Good News.....

It seems odd that Jesus would tell someone he just cured to keep silent about the whole incident. If I had experienced a miraculous cure, I think my first impulse would be to tell everyone about it and how it came to be. It's hard to keep that kind of good news to oneself. But Jesus' reasons for asking this went beyond mere modesty. He did not want people to follow him simply because of what he did. There were prophets and preachers at that time who called attention to God and appeared to cure those who were ill. They cast out demons and preached their understanding of the truth. But Jesus wasn't like any other person. He wanted people to look within themselves and believe in him because of who he was: Emmanuel, God with us.

If we believe in Jesus only because we have seen a miracle, then our faith is not rooted in a deep conviction of heart and mind. The first time something bad happens, our faith will waver. If we believe only because someone else told us to, then when that person exits our lives, our faith may stop. But if we have had a personal encounter with Christ mediated through sacraments, or in prayer, or through another person and have come to believe in Christ as the Son of God, then our faith will grow. It will see us through rocky times and brighten the rest of our days. We will be like someone whose eyes and ears have been opened, because we will see Christ present in the world and hear his voice calling to us to come and follow him.





FROM PASTOR'S DESK:

On reflecting upon Pope Francis' recent Encyclical, "On Care for Our Common Home", we have seen some of the challenges from a scientific perspective, and now the Encyclical looks upon "the Gospel of Creation" and particularly the difficulty when God is not taken into account in looking for solutions to our current crisis. Whether it is because of the outright rejection of the idea of a Creator God, or the consideration that this belief is irrelevant and simply the prerogative of the individual not extending beyond themselves, Pope Francis makes the case for science and religion entering into an intense dialogue fruitful for both [62]. Examining the rich contribution of biblical insights, Pope Francis states that the fundamental relationship humans have with God, with our neighbor and our created earth itself have been ruptured by sin particularly through a false understanding of humans having dominion over the earth. "We are not God. The earth was here before us and it has been given to us;" [67] and this given dominion over the earth does not justify absolute domination over other creatures and aspects of creation to do as we please with no accountability. We are invited to trust in all-powerful and all-loving God, Who desires that we work in cooperation with Him in caring for all that He has made. Pope Francis invites us away from a utilitarian view of the created order and other creatures, as if they exist simply to meet some need that we have, and beyond that have no greater purpose or meaning, as "the Church does not state that other creatures are completely subordinated to the good of human beings, as if they had no worth in themselves" [69]. "A spirituality which forgets God as all-powerful and Creator is not acceptable. That is how we end up worshipping earthly powers, or ourselves usurping the place of God, even to the point of claiming an unlimited right to trample his creation underfoot. The best way to restore men and women to their rightful place, putting an end to their claim to absolute dominion over the earth, is to speak once more of the figure of a Father who creates and who alone owns the world. Otherwise, human beings will always try to impose their own laws and interests on reality." [75]. Since our society has tried to marginalize God to the very fringe of considered reality, because we want to live according to our own dictates and ideas, and not to be in any way beholden to the Creator and Lord of the universe, it is not surprising to recognize the uphill battle that Pope Francis is up against in convincing the world and us Catholics also of the validity and importance of his insights and challenges into fostering a deeper care and reverence for all creation and especially our fellow human beings. Without acknowledging God, we flounder to find the same anchor elsewhere for our activity. {To be continued.....}
