Good News.....

The undergraduate students with whom I work are part of a generation whose opportunities to serve others began in grade school. Regardless of religious affiliation, culture, or race, these students raised money, contributed to canned food drives, helped at food pantries, or built houses with their classmates or fellow club members. Now in college, they have hundreds of opportunities to help those less fortunate which are sponsored by this nonreligious institution alone, let alone the many more offered by their respective religious house and communities. For the most part, they serve willingly, even eagerly. But I find that few of them sit down to reflect on the good work they do. They rarely consider the call to solidarity with the poor or the command of Christ to love one another. They just have a felt sense that they should.

For Catholics, as for all Christians, this felt sense has its roots in the faith we proclaim. If we truly believe that Christ is the Son of God and our Savior, our faith compels us to do what he did and to love as he loved. And it is more than that. Many people do service work because it's the right thing to do or because they want to give back. Those are good reasons. But we are called to be in a relationship of love with those we serve. We are challenged to see not only how we might serve them but to see the gifts they bring to us and how they shape our lives. We are called to accept them as our brothers and sisters.





FROM PASTOR'S DESK:

Continuing last week's reflection upon Pope Francis' recent Encyclical, "On Care for Our Common Home", we want to emphasize the importance of viewing all of creation through the eyes of God, because the very act of creating the universe and all that exists is the expression of God's magnificent love. "God's love is the fundamental moving force in all created things.... Every creature is thus the object of the Father's tenderness, who gives it its place in the world." [77] While Judaeo-Christian thought recognizes that all that exists flows out of God's love, and thus prompting us to admire its grandeur and immensity, we do not see nature as divine. This perspective underlines our human responsibility to acknowledge the value and fragility of nature, which is entrusted to us by God, so that we might "devise intelligent ways of directing, developing and limiting our power" [78]. Since "the biblical accounts of creation invite us to see each human being as a subject (with its own autonomy and direction) who can never be reduced to the status of an object," [81] "it would also be mistaken to view other living beings as mere objects subjected to arbitrary human domination. When nature is viewed solely as a source of profit and gain, this has serious consequences for society. This vision of 'might is right' has engendered immense inequality, injustice and acts of violence against the majority of humanity, since resources end up in the hands of the first comer or the most powerful: the winner takes all" [82]. 'The ultimate destiny of the universe is in the fullness of God, which has already beeb attained by the risen Christ, the measure of the maturity of all things....The ultimate purpose of other creatures is not to be found in us. Rather, all creatures are moving forward with us and through us towards a common point of arrival, which is God, in that transcendent fullness where the risen Christ embraces and illumines all things" [83] In other words, we are to lead all creatures back to their Creator. Being created in the image and likeness of God should not cause us to look down on the rest of creation, because "the entire material universe speaks of God's love, His boundless affection for us. Soil, water, mountains: everything is, as it were, a caress of God. The history of our friendship with God is always linked to particular places which take on an intensely personal meeting; we all remember places, and revisiting those memories does us much good" [84] Within the entirety of God's plan, we better appreciate the interdependence among all creatures, we also understand that God is reflected in all that exists, but never to the point of forgetting the infinite distance between God and what exists in the world, which do not possess His fullness. All reality belongs to God, as the supreme Owner. {To be continued.....}
