

FROM PASTOR'S DESK:

Continuing directly from last week's reflection upon Pope Francis' recent Encyclical, "On Care for Our Common Home", it is imperative to recognize that there can be no renewal of our relationship with nature without a renewal of humanity itself. We are not just one being among others, simply the product of chance or physical determinism, so that our overall sense of responsibility wanes. "Human beings cannot be expected to feel responsibility for the world unless, at the same time, their unique capacities of knowledge, will, freedom, and responsibility are recognized and valued." [118] "If the present ecological crisis is one small sign of the ethical, cultural and spiritual crisis of modernity, we cannot presume to heal our relationship with nature and the environment without healing all fundamental human relationships; ...our relationship with the environment can never be isolated from our relationship with others and with God." [119] Pope Francis affirms clearly how respect for human life at all stages of development is paramount in developing a heightened consciousness and care for the environment, in what is a strong endorsement of a pro-life stance in our approach to nature. "Since everything is interrelated, concern for the protection of nature is also incompatible with the justification of abortion. How can we genuinely teach the importance of concern for other vulnerable beings, however troublesome or inconvenient they may be, if we fail to protect a human embryo, even when its presence is uncomfortable and creates difficulties? 'If personal and social sensitivity towards the acceptance of the new life is lost, then other forms of acceptance that are valuable for society also wither away." [120] Earlier in The Joy of the Gospel, Pope Francis pointed out that practical relativism is even more dangerous than doctrinal relativism, because it gives absolute priority to immediate convenience and sees everything as irrelevant unless it serves one's own immediate interests. [122] "The culture of relativism is the same disorder which drives one person to take advantage of another, to treat others as mere objects, imposing forced labour on them or enslaving them to pay their debts, to the sexual exploitation of children and abandonment of the elderly who no longer serve our interests." This is the mindset behind those who advocate the rationale: "Let us allow the invisible forces of the market to regulate the economy, and consider their impact on society and nature as collateral damage." [123] If there is nothing beyond the satisfaction of our own desires and immediate needs, then it is harder to regulate or limit human trafficking, organized crime, the drug trade, commerce in blood diamonds and the fur of endangered species, buying the organs of the poor for resale or use in experimentation, or the elimination of children because they are not what their parents wanted. *{To be continued......}*
