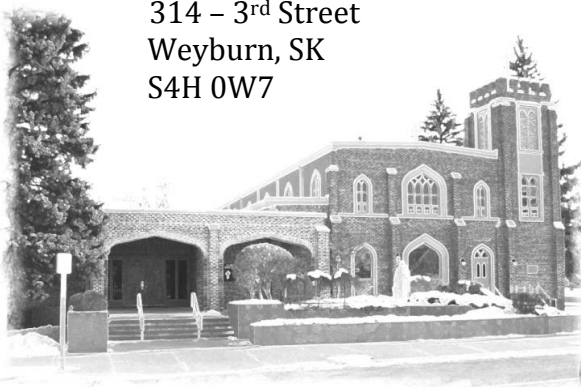

Listening to Jesus' words in today's gospel: "It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God," many of us sat back in our seats and breathed a sigh of relief. We are not rich, and thank God. It must be easier for us to enter heaven. Right?

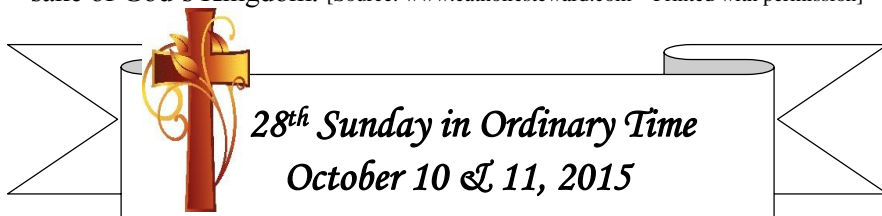
But the fact is, whether we are wealthy according to the world's standards or not, Jesus' words are meant for every single one of us. We are all very rich. God has given us innumerable gifts – our time, our talents, our treasure, our very lives are gifts from the Lord. We have so much, and as Christ's disciples, we are called to give it all to the Lord – to use our time, our talents, and our treasure to serve God and build His kingdom.

Living a life of stewardship as a Christian disciple requires giving 100 percent of ourselves. It means living our lives for the Lord and giving all we have and all we are to serve Him. This is not an easy task. It is radical but it's richly rewarding.

At the end of today's gospel, Jesus exclaims, "Truly, I tell you, there is no one who has left house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or fields, for my sake and for the sake of the good news, who will not receive a hundredfold now in this present age: houses and brothers and sisters and mothers and children and fields, but with persecutions, and in the age to come, eternal life." Have you given all that you have to serve the Lord?

One of the ways to give to the Lord and thus follow and serve Him is through the Archdiocesan Annual Appeal. 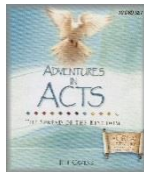

FROM PASTOR'S DESK:

As we continue reflecting upon Pope Francis' recent Encyclical, "On Care for Our Common Home", our attention is directed towards the value of labour and how this must be protected to ensure that everyone has the opportunity to participate in meaningful work, not only to provide livelihood for families but to contribute to the good of the world. Even within Christian monasticism, which originally was understood as a flight from the world and escape from the decadence of cities, seeking the desert as the best place to encounter the presence of God, thanks to St. Benedict of Nursia, there came the recognition of living in community, combining prayer and spiritual reading with manual labour. "Seeing manual labour as spiritually meaningful proved revolutionary. Personal growth and sanctification came to be sought in the interplay of recollection and work. This way of experiencing work makes us more protective and respectful of the environment; it imbues our relationship to the world with a healthy sobriety." [126] Convinced that 'man is the source, the focus and the aim of all economic and social life,' "once our human capacity for contemplation and reverence is impaired, it becomes easy for the meaning of work to be misunderstood." Special priority must be given to access to steady employment for everyone, despite the thinking in business circles focusing on the reduction of production costs by laying off workers and replacing them with machines. "The loss of jobs also has a negative impact on the economy 'through the progressive erosion of social capital: the network of relationships of trust, dependability, and respect for rules, all of which are indispensable for any form of civil coexistence.'" [128] "We are created with a vocation to work. The goal should not be that technological progress increasingly replace human work, for this would be detrimental to humanity. Work is a necessity, part of the meaning of life on earth, a path to growth, human development and personal fulfillment. Helping the poor financially must always be a provisional solution in the face of pressing needs. The broader objective should always be to allow them a dignified life through work." [128] This section and particularly its cautions on fostering the "economies of scale" will no doubt upset some people who have bought into this rationale, but there is evidence that "there is a great variety of small-scale food production systems which feed the greater of the world's peoples, using a modest amount of land and producing less waste, be it in small agricultural parcels, in orchards and gardens, hunting and wild harvesting or local fishing. Governments should work in ensuring that all can earn a suitable livelihood and not be forced out because of economic policies favouring the larger units of production.
