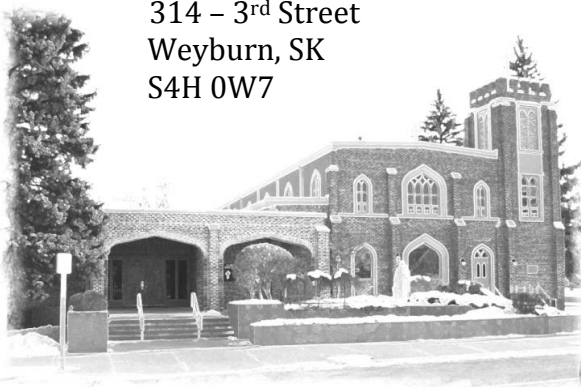

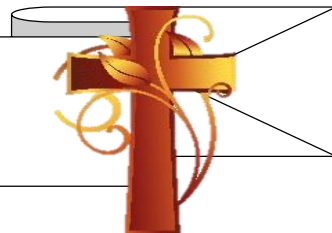
Today's readings draw our attention to the final judgment. The end will come. "Heaven and Earth will pass away," and "about that day or hour, no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father," we do know, though, that it will come. And each one of us will stand face-to-face with our creator. Will He be pleased with how we've lived, and with what we've done with the many gifts He's given us?

Today's Gospel message is about the End times, and it offers us a great opportunity to reflect on the meaning of our lives. We know that we were not created to live our lives on Earth forever. We were created to live for God, to live in unity with Him. Our lives in heaven will consist of perfect unity with God; our whole being will be centered on loving and praising Him. Yet, there is no reason for that to wait until we've entered eternal glory. In fact, it cannot wait. While we look forward to the day when we will greet the Lord, while we know that heaven is our home, that eternal glory is our goal, we are charged to live in the present. God has placed us here for a reason. He has a mission for each one of us, and He expects us to make good use of the time He has given us on Earth — to praise Him in the way we live our lives, to unite ourselves with Him in the sacraments, and to show forth His glory by serving others in His name.

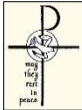

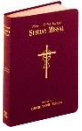

FROM PASTOR'S DESK:

In our reflection upon Pope Francis' recent Encyclical, "On Care for Our Common Home", Pope Francis invites to reflect seriously upon the intergenerational solidarity that must be brought to bear any sustainable development, so that we don't saddle our children and grandchildren with an enormous environmental debt to handle. Spending our heritage is not a very prudent manner to live, with no concern on how this will impact future generations. The current rampant individualism along with today's self-centered culture of instant gratification is making it harder for us to face our sense of accountability regarding the deterioration of the environment. [159-162] Pope Francis then reviews the need for a more interdependent world where solutions emerge from not defending the interests of a few countries, by looking at the failures of the well-intentioned and even courageous proposals coming the so-called earth and world summits on the environment. What has happened all too often has been the lack of political will and the practical implementations to seriously embrace the expectations of these recent world summits. Unless this changes, then future generations will be left to suffer the consequences of ill-advised delays. [169] Never losing sight of the double pronged approach of reversing the environmental damage and eliminating poverty, Pope Francis argues for a greater collaboration by all governments and sectors to work in ways that would result in positive outcomes on both fronts, because otherwise we will continue witnessing the domination of the economic and financial sectors, which are transnational by nature over the political process and will. [175] Since it is not enough to avoid bad practices, but necessarily to promote best practices in terms of the environment, the short-term view of power politics and the view of being re-elected hampers the long-term efforts that are often needed. Unless there is a sustained involvement and pressure from both individuals and civic institutions, political authorities will be reluctant to intervene and act because this would clash with the "mindset of short-term gain and results which dominates present-day economics and politics." [181] Rather than considering environment impact assessments as an add-on at the end of the project just ensure that it is safe-to-go, these studies need to be engaged from the outset in tangent with the whole project being proposed. [183] This means that several questions must be asked if this contributes to genuine integral development: "what will it accomplish? Why? Where? How? For whom? What are the risks? What are the costs? Who will pay those costs and how?", with some questions having a higher priority given the particular project. [185] While it is not easy to reach this broad consensus, it is preferred to limit ourselves to short-term sighted policies and procedures.
