Good News!

Today is called "Gaudete" Sunday because today's Mass begins with the opening antiphon, "Gaudete in Domino semper" ("Rejoice in the Lord always"). Today we light the rose candle of the Advent wreath, and the priest may wear rose vestments to express our communal joy in the coming of Jesus, as our Savior. The theme of the third Sunday of Advent is rejoicing in hope. Advent is a time for joy, not only because we are anticipating the anniversary of the birth of Jesus, but also because God is already in our midst. Christian joy does not come from the absence of sorrow, pain or trouble, but from an awareness of the presence of Christ within our souls.

In today's first reading, the prophet Zephaniah says, "Shout for joy, O Zion! Sing joyfully, O Israel." Zephaniah made this prophetic proclamation at the height of the Jewish exile when things appeared hopeless and unbearable. The instruct tion is repeated in the response to the Psalm, "Sing and shout for joy for great in your midst is the Holy One of Israel."

St. Paul echoes the same message of joy in the second reading, taken from his letter to the Philippians: "Rejoice in the Lord always. I shall say it again, rejoice... The Lord is in your midst... Fear not... be not discouraged... The Lord is near. Have no anxiety at all..." Paul was imprisoned when he made this appeal for rejoicing.

In the gospel today, John the Baptist explains the secret of Christian joy as wholehearted commitment to God's way by doing His will. A sad Christian is a contradiction in terms. According to the Baptizer, happiness comes from doing our duties faithfully, doing good to others and sharing our blessings with others. John's call to repentance is a call to joy and restoration. Repentance means a change in the purpose and direction of our lives. Filled with joyful expectation that the Messiah was near, the people asked John, "What should we do?" He told them to act with justice, charity and honesty, letting their lives reflect their transformation.

For us, that transformation occurs when Christ enters our lives, and it is to be reflected in our living in the ways John suggested.

FROM PASTOR'S DESK:

In our reflection upon Pope Francis' recent Encyclical, "On Care for Our Common Home", Pope Francis continues his thoughts on the spirituality necessary for an integral appreciation of the environment, "which approaches life with serene attentiveness, which is capable of being fully present to someone without thinking of what comes next, which accepts each moment as a gift from God to be lived to the full." [226] As ordinary and simple as it may sound, Pope Francis encourages us to recover the practice of stopping and giving thanks to God before and after meals, because it "reminds us of our dependence on God for life; it strengthens our feeling of gratitude for the gifts of creation; it acknowledges those who by their labours provide us with these goods; and it reaffirms our solidarity with those in greatest need." [227] With a view of regaining "the conviction that we need one another, that we have a shared responsibility for others and the world, and that being good and decent are worth it" [229], Pope Francis turns to the example of St. Therese of Lisieux' practice of the 'Little Way', whereby we never "miss out on a kind word, a smile or any small gesture which sows peace and friendship." These simple daily gestures practiced constantly and regularly help "break with the logic of violence, exploitation and selfishness" which are expressive of a "world of exacerbated consumption." [230] When our love overflows with these small gestures of mutual care, it transforms the civic and political order as the "exercise of charity matures and sanctifies us" in the process and becomes the motivation to our involvement in the political process. [231] Thus St. Bonaventure teaches us that 'contemplation deepens the more we feel the working of God's grace within our hearts, and the better we learn to encounter God in creatures outside our- selves.' [233] Since "the sacraments are a privileged way in which nature is taken up by God to become a means of mediating supernatural life," "all the creatures of the material universe find their true meaning in the incarnate Word, for the Son of God has incorporated in His person part of the material world, planting in it a seed of definitive transformation." [235] Pope Francis states that "it is in the Eucharist that all that has been created finds its greatest exaltation", because "the Eucharist joins heaven and earth; it embraces and penetrates all creation. The world which came forth from God's hands returns to Him in blessed and undivided adoration: in the bread of the Eucharist, 'creation is projected towards divinization, towards the holy wedding feast, towards unification with the Creator Himself.' Thus, the Eucharist is also a source of light and motivation for our concerns for the environment, directing us to be stewards of all creation." [236] {To be continued....}
