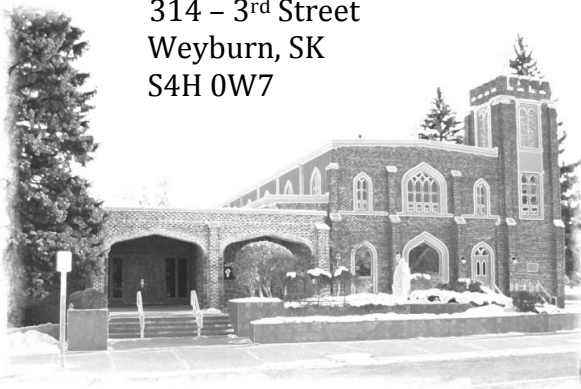

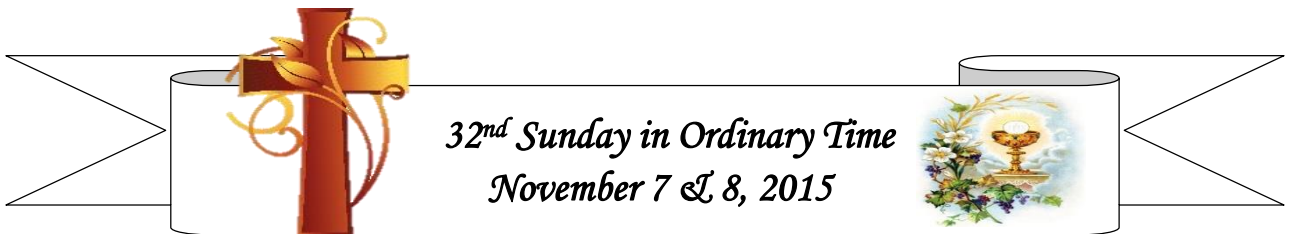
Today's gospel offers us a great lesson in the stewardship way of life. Mark tells us that Jesus sat and watched as many people put money into the treasury. And while he watched many wealthy men give enormous amounts of money, it was one widow who gave but two small coins that caught His attention. At first glance it seems clear that she did not give as much as the many wealthy people. Yet, Jesus assured the disciples, "she gave the most" because while the others were giving out of their surplus, she was giving of her first fruits. She was giving everything she had. For her, the gift was a sacrifice.


She stands as a great example to us. We are called to give our all. We give not because we have extra left over like many of the wealthy people in today's gospel, we give – of our time, our talents, and our treasure, because we want to express to God how grateful we are for all He has given us.

How well do our commitments of time, talent, and treasure express our gratitude to God? Are we giving because it's easy, because we have a surplus to give from, or are we giving because we are grateful for God's many gifts, and, therefore, offering our whole selves back to Him?

When we give a portion of God's gift of treasure to us in the Archdiocesan Annual Appeal we give like the widows in the scriptures, who gave freely from their need. We are sure God will multiply our humble gift enough for the needs of those who minister to His love in our Archdiocese. God doesn't count numbers, only a grateful heart.



 Offering the body and blood of Christ.

Liturgy and Worship is the focal point of our Catholic Faith, where we come together as Catholics to celebrate the fundamental beliefs of our Faith. Our worship is enriched when members of the parish participate in various ministries. These ministries provide many opportunities for the sharing of our time and talent and for giving back the gifts God has given us.

Stewardship opportunity: To assist the celebrant at Mass in the distribution of Communion and the Cup.
Talent/Gift to offer: An attitude of reverence toward the Sacrament and a willingness to help the people of God share in full communion.
Time commitment: Eucharistic Ministers undergo a brief training session prior to starting the ministry. After training, they serve approximately once a month at a scheduled liturgy. At each liturgy, one or two ministers also purify the communion vessels in the priests' sacristy after Mass.
Treasure/Blessing received: An opportunity to participate in offering the true presence of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ as well as fostering a reverence for the graces received in the Eucharist.

FROM PASTOR'S DESK:

In our ongoing reflection upon Pope Francis' recent Encyclical, "On Care for Our Common Home", he addresses some points of urban and rural planning and development in which balance in people's quality of life and preservation of certain aspects of the landscape must be weighed against the type of infrastructure which supports this human dignity and the aspirations to wholesome living. Lack of housing in both urban and rural settings should be addressed since "having a home has much to do with a sense of personal dignity and the growth in families. [152] There is a word encouraging better public transportation which would combat the pollution by the abundance of single usage vehicles on our already over-clogged roads. Next Pope Francis tackles the relationship of human life and moral law by quoting Pope Benedict XVI's assertion that "man has a nature that he must respect and that he cannot manipulate at will." Pope Francis continues: "The acceptance of our bodies as God's gift is vital for welcoming and accepting the entire world as a gift from the Father and our common home, whereas thinking that we enjoy absolute power over our own bodies turns, often subtly, into thinking that we enjoy absolute power over creation. Learning to accept our body, to care for it and to respect its fullest meaning, is an essential element of any genuine human ecology. Also, valuing one's own body in its femininity and masculinity is necessary if I am going to be able to recognize myself in an encounter with someone who is different. In this way we can joyfully accept the specific gifts of another man or woman, the work of God the Creator, and find mutual enrichment. It is not a healthy attitude which would seek 'to cancel out sexual differences because it no longer knows how to confront it.'" [155] Next, Pope Francis addresses how human ecology is inseparable from the common good, which is defined as "the sum of those conditions of social life which allow social groups and their individual members relatively thorough and ready access to their own fulfillment." [156] "Underlying the principle of the common good is respect for the human person as such, endowed with basic and inalienable rights ordered to his or her integral development. Fundamental to the common good is the family and its functioning, which society as a whole and the State in particular is called upon to defend and promote as the common good. Here the common good calls for the application of the principle of subsidiarity (whereby the effectiveness of action is taken to most local possible level rather than being overly centralized and further removed from the local level); and it involves "a summons to solidarity and a preferential option for the poorest of our brothers and sisters."
