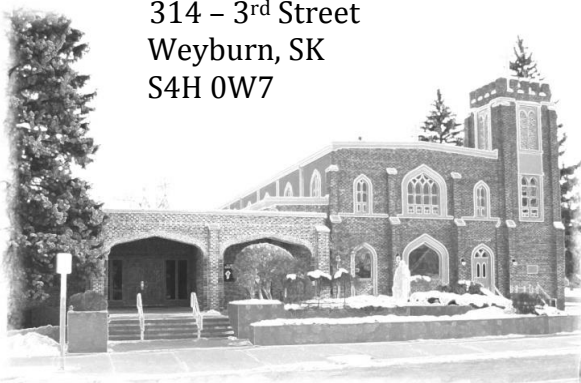

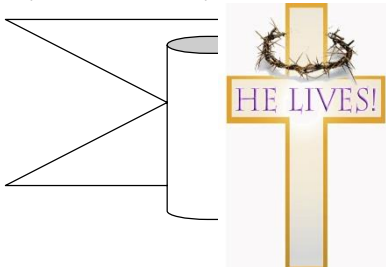

### Good News!

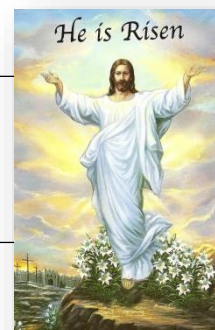
I love the sound water makes when it is moving in a fast-flowing stream or curling up to the shore in waves. I am mesmerized particularly by waterfalls, small or large. My husband, who enjoys photography as a hobby, has taken pictures of many of the falls we have visited, and they decorate my office as a constant reminder of the power and beauty of God seen through all creation. I even have a crucifix that was designed to show the living water flowing from Christ—a waterfall tumbling down and over the foot of the cross. It is, for me anyway, one of the most powerful images of God that I can imagine.

Throughout the Easter season, the Scriptures present us with stories of resurrection and life. The preaching of the apostles, the abundance of fish caught in a net, the stirring of hearts in those who see and hear Jesus—they all show what it is like to live in “risen time,” in full knowledge and endless presence of the Lord. Today Jesus talks about God’s closeness, power, and promise. The Father has given the sheep to Jesus and no one can take them away. But in the reading from Revelation we have a clearer picture of our life with God: “The Lamb [will] lead them to springs of life-giving water.” In Jesus’ desert environment, this was a powerful image. In our world today it remains compelling. Jesus is the Living Water that brings life to our souls. Whether it flows as a gentle stream, restless wave, or waterfall from the throne of God, it is his gift to us.

#### FROM PASTOR'S DESK:

I want to thank everyone for their contributions and written submissions to the Parish Office regarding the discussion of what to do with our Baptismal Font, as it has been greatly appreciated and has generated much discussion at the Parish Pastoral Council meetings. This matter was brought to Parish Council from the Knights of Columbus, who, along with several parishioners, were concerned about the congestion and limited area of our foyer for the gathering of the family at funerals and for Coffee Sundays. After our most recent Parish Pastoral Council meeting in which it had been voted to remove the baptismal font, but only when something suitable (such as a smaller and workable Font) could be found to replace it. Following the meeting, John Nikolejsin and I were able to determine that there is an accessible circulating pump next the water heater in the photocopy room cupboard, which would make it easy to replace the circulating pump if in fact it had seized and dried up from non-use. Then John contacted Bath-Fitters to explore whether they could come up with a liner to fix the apparent leak that developed several years ago in the outside liner and after a few attempts of caulking and gluing where the crack was thought to be was deemed unsuccessful and the water was drained from the reservoir. The original liner was cemented into the perimeter wall under the top layer of bricks, so replacing it would have been difficult, short dismantling the top layer of bricks, as permanent adhesion to the wall would have been problematic otherwise. John's ongoing investigation has located an individual within the province who has apparently installed a similar baptismal font in a parish in the Prince Albert Diocese, and he has agreed to come down in the near future to examine our font and determine if he can fix it. There has been discussion to possibly removing the planter around the font and finishing the flooring with some tile work, thus preserving the original Font itself under the sky-light and making it a more accessible feature for people themselves upon entering and leaving the Church. Brian Winter brought up the problem of algae and the odor that has arisen in the past and this we will also address at this time, as part of our rejuvenating of our Baptismal Font. Everyone's input on this matter has been beneficial and I appreciate that a practical solution may have found with people working together. This is not all accomplished, but hopefully we are moving in the right direction on this matter. Since it had generated some strong reactions with pro and con, I thought it best to dispel some of the emotions that were been generated and not have this overwhelm any other discussion at the Parish AGM.
