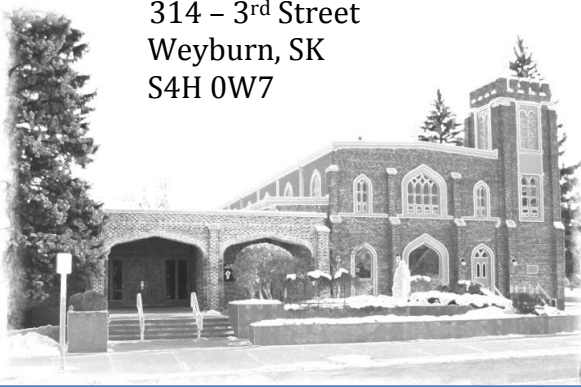

Good News!

I was fortunate to do my hospital chaplaincy rotation with a young seminarian who was ordained about three years after our summer experience. Tom and I became good friends. He came to my wedding and I went to his ordination. My children forever referred to him as young Fr. Tom. He has been a blessing to me and my family.

When he was ordained, I tried my hand at writing a song as a gift for him. He was so eager and willing to preach the Gospel wherever he was sent that I wanted to mark that in some way. One lyric I wrote went like this: "Finding our homes where we can share your word, only to leave again when it's been heard...to be your people." Fr. Tom serves in Africa now, training other seminarians, and I often think of him and of that song because I have come to realize that we are all called to share God's word whether we are in a comfortable place or a strange one. Perhaps part of our challenge is to leave the areas where we are comfortable and welcomed for those where the path is rougher and less clear, but the need for the Good News is all the greater.

Today our models are Paul and his companions, who travel from place to place to preach the Gospel and move on when they have done what they can. They follow Jesus' command to love and find the glory of the Lord in that work and in whom they serve. If we are to be God's people, we, too, must spread the hope of God's love to all we meet, even if we have to travel far to do so.

FROM PASTOR'S DESK:

During this Year of Mercy, we might be increasing our devotion to the Chaplet to the Divine Mercy, consciously striving to put into practice the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy, all as external practices of our lives but not really growing in our direct appreciation of God's loving mercy towards us nor extending it to those towards whom we must be more merciful and forgiving. Although I was not able to attend last week's Archdiocesan Catholic's Women League Convention in Regina last Sunday and Monday, I understand that Archbishop emeritus James Weisgerber spoke on the theme of Mercy as its keynote presenter. The brief report I heard of what he had said is what generated my own reflection this particular Sunday. We can be attentive to many different aspects of mercy which is well and good, but still missing out in its application to our lives in a very specific way, namely that we are to be recipients of God's mercy ourselves and then to become extenders of God's mercy to others, including those in our immediate surroundings. Certainly the Year of Mercy should be the occasion of more frequent reception of the sacrament of Reconciliation, as we become more aware of how much God desires us to know and experience His merciful forgiveness in the midst of our brokenness and frailty, for we often fail to live out our love and commitment to God and to our neighbours in a variety of ways. It is not just the sins and the wrongs that we commit and do, but just as often the omissions and the good that we fail to do. How often we can be aware of what we should do and find excuses for avoiding our responsibilities in many areas of life, either because it is inconvenient, fearful to venture forth or we become judgmental towards the other person. Sometimes we are just reluctant to put ourselves out for God and others as we are afraid that it will be too costly or too demanding of our time and resources. When it comes to our relationship, we can settle into a comfortable routine, whereby we attend Mass and say our regular prayers without engaging ourselves too much so that we trying to bring more concentration and attention to what we are doing and praying. Sadly we might just be going through the motions but not being significantly changed nor desiring to be changed by the experience, so that we strive to become more Christ-like in our thoughts, conversations and activities, in terms of being more loving, forgiving, merciful, compassionate, humble, gentle, and pure of heart. When we become more conscious of how dependent we are throughout our whole lives upon God's great mercy personally to us, then we can start extending this mercy to those we come across in our regular day, both in family and others, those we speak to and about, and those we work with and interact in the course of our days. May God's merciful love help us to relate with the same mercy He constantly encounters us with.
