
Good News!

In our time, seven days have passed since we celebrated Christ's rising. But in the Church's reckoning, it is still Easter. We may have gotten on with our earthly lives, but our spiritual calendar (and reality) remains steeped in awe, wonder, and gratitude that God incarnate walked among us and gave his life for us. The readings of the Easter Octave offer a taste of what it is like to live in God's time—in his presence and kingdom—as he calms our fears, strengthens our faith, and fills us with the Spirit. Much happens after Mary Magdalene visits and leaves the tomb. Other women who come to anoint Jesus meet him, embrace him, and obey his command to spread the Good News. Mary herself obeyed and ran to tell the apostles—though she mistook the Lord for a gardener until he spoke her name. Two disciples on the road out of town listen to Jesus' teaching and finally know him in the breaking of bread. Jesus eats with others and assures them of the Father's promise. There is another miraculous catch of fish and a breakfast with the disciples on the Sea of Galilee.

Within the scriptural context of this weeklong feast, we realize that the risen Christ is everywhere, with all of us, and existing throughout and beyond time. He appears when we least expect him; he is our teacher and our master; he feeds us with heavenly food; and he is there when we break bread together. May this knowledge strengthen our faith that Christ lives and will in time carry us home.

FROM PASTOR'S DESK:

We continue celebrating the Risen Christ on this Second Sunday of Easter under the title of Divine Mercy, along with the image which our Lord in a vision commissioned St. Faustina to have painted and venerated, with rays red and white (pale) light emanating and streaming from His Heart, pierced on the cross from which flowed blood and water. The devotions of the Divine Mercy, including the chaplet and Novena, along with reading the Diary of St. Faustina, all serve to emphasize the deep connection between Jesus' death and resurrection and how the Mercy of God flows out to the whole world, enveloping everyone in its influence and mystery. This Jubilee Year of Mercy helps to connect the image of the Divine Mercy and its devotions with a renewed appreciation, as we strive to incorporate into our regular prayers when driving or going about our day, and most especially if we can pause at 3 o'clock in the afternoon for the few minutes it takes to pray the Chaplet to the Divine Mercy. Just imagine the spiritual energy generated for the good of the world if more people would stop to pray the Chaplet at 3 PM each day, literally the Hour of Mercy! Let us not confuse as meaning we must pray for the whole next hour, but rather specifically at the third hour of every afternoon. Jesus spoke these words to St. Faustina: "I remind you, My daughter, that as often as you hear the clock strike the third hour, immerse yourself completely in My mercy, adoring and glorifying it; invoke its omnipotence for the whole world, and particularly for poor sinners; for at that moment mercy was opened wide for every soul. This hour of My death on the cross was the hour of grace for the whole world -- mercy triumphed over justice. Try your best to make the Stations of the Cross in this hour, provided that your duties permit it; and if you are not able to make the Stations of the Cross, then at least step into the chapel for a moment and adore, in the Blessed Sacrament, My Heart, which is full of mercy; and should you be unable to step into the chapel, immerse yourself in prayer there where you happen to be, if only for a very brief instant." (1572- Diary) In one's meditations while praying the Chaplet to the Divine Mercy, one could take the images of the Sorrowful Mysteries of the Rosary or that of the fourteen Stations of the Cross to help us focus our concentration on what Christ has suffered and done for us. It is truly amazing and grace-filled to take this moment in the mid- afternoon every day and how the spiritual meditation and reflection gives a different colour and tone to the rest of the day; even though at first we might thought that it was an inconvenient interruption to our day and activities. When planned and taken to heart, it reminds us of the great love and mercy that Christ has showered upon us and the whole world.
