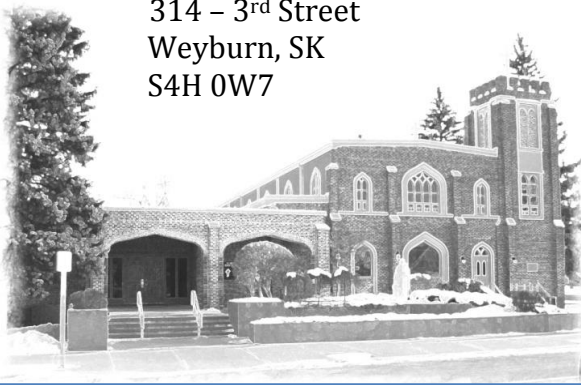

Good News!

For many Catholics, Vatican Council II was a watershed moment in Church history. I remember the nuns in our school turning on the radio to listen to reports. They shared what Pope St. John XXIII said at the start of the council. The media still follow large Church events, but it's easy to forget that Church leaders have been gathering to talk about the issues of the day since the first century.

In the first reading, we hear (in fairly abbreviated form) about the Council of Jerusalem. The apostles and other leaders of the Church came together to discuss whether Gentiles had to be circumcised (a tenet of Jewish Law) before they were baptized. There were legitimate claims on both sides. Remarkably, the lead prayed, talked, and prayed some more. They spoke from their experience and their faith. They assumed that all the assembled were people of faith, and so they wrestled together to find the answer most in keeping with the commands of Jesus.

In the end, when they decided to admit Gentiles without circumcising them, the whole community recognized that the Holy Spirit was at work, and the letter sent to the various churches began, "It is the decision of the Holy Spirit and of us..." The Council of Jerusalem gives us a model for resolving our differences: pray, dialogue, and pray some more. This week, read all of Acts 15 to see what happens when we trust the Spirit to guide us rightly: arguments fall silent, and we find delight, strength, and peace (see 15:12, 31–32; John 14:27).

FROM PASTOR'S DESK:

A memo was received from Gilles L'Heureux (St. Joseph's Parish, Moose Jaw) on behalf of Colette Stang, President of the Saskatchewan Pro-Life Association (SPLA) regarding the small window of opportunity to submit short briefs of **750 / 3 pages** to the Standing Committee on Justice & Human Rights on **Bill C-14**, an Act to amend the Criminal Code and to make related amendments to other Acts on Medical Assistance in Dying. The Canadian public is invited to submit briefs to this Standing Committee no later than Monday, May 2, 2016 at 5 PM, and the link received from the Memo of SPLA to which one can attach your submission is Just@parl.gc.ca. My suggestion is that briefs be thoughtfully and concisely written stating our direct opposition to this proposed bill, indicating that we are opposed to any allowance of euthanasia and assisted suicide in Canada. This must not be allowed to proceed without stating our opposition to something that will radically alter our country's stance not only on dying but living with dignity. Most countries which have implemented legislation favouring euthanasia have witnessed the slippery slope of its being extended to more and circumstances and categories of people. There is no one who at some does not experience some pain in living, quite apart from the pain of dying; and it seems that they are advocating the right to terminate their life, if they deem it unacceptable that they should be forced to carry on living. Anyone who has dealt with the suicide of someone knows the great pain and anguish suffered by those who are left behind. Suicide prevention advocates strongly argue that suicide not be presented as a rational alternative to suffering, and yet as Andrew Coyne recently wrote, that is exactly what we are doing. The reality, he argues, is that when we permit assisted suicide, we are involving another individual, or individuals, to help that person carry their wishes to die directly by the intervention proposed, and this implicates all of us, and makes all complicit in their actions. Surely we can do better as a society to aid and abet someone to end their lives, because they have decided that it is not worth living and have others of their point of view. If ever there was a time to make our voice heard, it is now because we cannot imagine what the future might bring and how more removed from God our country will become if this proposed legislation goes into effect. Those who have been fighting for the change or restrictions on abortion know how difficult this battle has become; it will be no different for euthanasia. Will good statistics be kept on this matter, as patient confidentiality and privacy will be presented as reasons why there should be no disclosure? What about the Church being asked to celebrate sacraments with those who are headed this way, or funerals for that matter? St. Joseph, Patron of Canada, pray for us..
