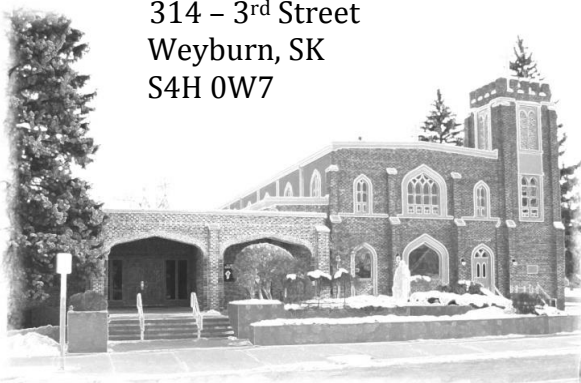

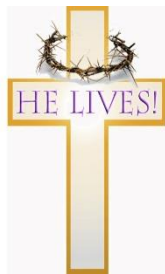
Good News!

It has become the habit in our family to say, “I love you” at the end of phone calls and emails. I love these frequent reminders that I am valued and worthy of love, and I like the opportunity to remind my daughters and husband that they are the same. We underscore these reminders with little acts of love. Our daughters joke that my husband and I are the only parents they know who still date. And when we do go out, we take turns paying for the other’s dinner. My husband once sent me flowers when I didn’t get a job I had hoped for. It was a kind and thoughtful gesture.

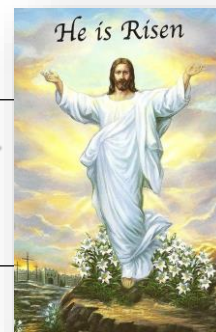
In the Gospel, Jesus asks Peter, “Do you love me” not once, but three times. When Peter responds positively (though progressively with more irritation), Jesus continues, “Feed my lambs... Tend my sheep... Feed my sheep.” It isn’t enough to say we love someone. We show it by caring for them and for who and what they cherish. The best way that Peter could show his love for Jesus was by caring for the people of God. He could love all the disciples and invite others to follow Jesus as well. Pope Francis once exhorted priests to “be shepherds, with the ‘odor of the sheep.’ ” Jesus is telling Peter—and all of us—much the same thing. To love the Lord is to truly live among his people: to touch them, tell them and show them they are valuable and desired. This is the face of love.

All people deserve to know they are loved, but in our world that is not always the case. How might we respond?

FROM PASTOR'S DESK:

Several times in the Acts of the Apostles, Peter and the Apostles defend themselves against the demand that they stop preaching in the name of the Risen Lord by simply returning to the statement: "We must obey God rather than men." As we reflect upon this statement, we would do well to adopt it in our own lives as a guiding principle by which we seek to live in our daily lives. Whether it is the matter of abortion or euthanasia, along with other moral matters regarding family life and marriage, Peter's statement remains the sound principle to shape our response to society's approach and the Church's teachings, especially when these are in conflict and opposed to each other. With the growing secularization of our society and our governments enacting legislation that directly contradicts the Church's teachings on many fundamental issues, many people are very quick to adopt what seems to be promoted by the popular opinions of our times. Without the proper Catholic formation and understanding many people are confused about the articulation of Catholic teachings, and they are quite ready to accept societal views. When the influence of governments, along with our educational and medical establishments, along with the social and public media, become as pervasive as they become of late, then many people, especially our youth, are easily persuaded to go along with the popular trends. Without realizing it, many have already succumbed to becoming obedient to our society's point of view, rather than to God. It is not easy to resist the pressure and influence of what seems to be the popular trend. In this sense, we witness fewer Catholics being counter-cultural and ready to stand for principles of faith when it comes to what seems to have become acceptable by our mainstream society. We are reluctant to make waves or to rock the boat because the majority of us have been silenced by the court of human opinion, or the sense that it is none of our business what others are doing or that it doesn't affect us directly. By our silence and going along with what is happening around us, we are showing ourselves less inclined to be obedient to God's way and more to man's way. We might grumble and complain but rarely do we take any effective steps to make our voices heard and activities seen on a positive manner to show our support and belief that all life is sacred. Rather than questioning what our governments and popular media are telling us on any number of moral issues, we just accept it and go along with whatever is being proposed almost blindly. Perhaps it is because we have taken the time to become informed and knowledgeable about the truths and the beauty of our Catholic faith despite the fact that our parish has offered many programs of study and brought in quality speakers to inform and enlighten us.
