Good News! February 7, 2016 FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (C)

In her later years, my mother lived on a lake in Wisconsin, not far from our home. There, our daughters learned to swim and fish. One day, when our younger daughter was about eight, we went to the end of the pier to fish quietly. She had learned to cast her rod after a fashion and was happily doing that when I looked out to where I expected to see the bobber on her line and realized it wasn't there. Just as I started to ask about it, she gave a little yell as her line suddenly took off and she grabbed her rod to hang on. She saw the foot-long bass jump out of the water a little distance away and her eyes widened. With some help, she got the fish to the pier, where my husband netted it. The amazement of a child who had never caught more than small fish was evident, and she proudly helped clean it for the evening meal.

I can only imagine what the apostles, who were seasoned fishermen, felt that day on the Sea of Galilee, the subject of today's Gospel. Likely it was amazement at this stranger who apparently knew more about fishing than they did, but there was also a glimpse of an abundance they didn't know was possible and a sense that Jesus meant life for them. Peter drops to his knees, suddenly aware of his doubts and sins. Jesus simply tells him not to be afraid, shows him what he can do with God's help, and waits for him to follow. Let's approach the life God calls us to with the same amazement and humility.



<u>Stewardship</u> - Love is patient, love is kind. It is not jealous, it is not pompous." (1 Corinthians 13:4) Do you get jealous? At times we are all guilty of these things. Pray for more humility. Pray to become less self-centered and more God-centered.

<u>Year of Mercy</u> When speaking to others, the love and mercy of God must flow from our lips. But how? What should our speech look like? One way to examine our speech to others is to look at it in the light of how we should speak to God. When speaking to God we should speak with honesty, simplicity, humility and confidence. And if we speak to God with these qualities, they will also be a good guide in our speech to others.

Reflect upon the people and conversations that you have. Do you speak from pride or sarcasm? Do you struggle with gossip or carelessness? Think about what your speech would look like if it were honest, simple, humble and confident in God's grace. Joy will be present in each conversation guided by these virtues.

FROM PASTOR'S DESK:

With Lent beginning with Ash Wednesday on February 10th, we have an excellent opportunity to grow in our awareness and appreciation of God's mercy towards us and our corresponding responsibility to share mercy with all others whom we encounter in our daily lives. Mercy remains God's primary manner of reaching out to us, despite our own ignorance, arrogance and sinful failures, as it is the constant mode of God's relationship with His people throughout the Bible, in the unfolding of salvation history. Despite the numerous failures of God's people to remain faithful to His commandments and covenant, God is ever ready to offer them His mercy and forgiveness, and ultimately this happened in a very direct and dramatic way when God sent His only begotten Son to live, die and rise from the dead for us and our salvation. Our salvation is only possible because God has forgiven our sins by offering the atoning death of His Son on our behalf, and there is no other way that we can be saved and brought into eternal life with God in heaven. Our Lenten fasting and prayers spurs us to a greater generosity of heart for those who are in need of mercy, whether it is in their physical, emotional, or spiritual needs. The face of mercy to those who are hungry and poor must reflect an adequate response to their actual needs, just as it would to those presenting different needs, so that we most accurately show the face of Christ responding to their situation. In this regard mercy often involves the willingness of accompaniment and solidarity with those who are suffering in some way, for this is exactly what Christ has done and continues to do constantly for us through the mystery of His Incarnation and His promise to be with us until the end of time. In our present culture, where we have an abundance of food and a wide variety of choices generally, it would be good to take up the practice of fasting and abstinence, even though we in Canada are only obliged to doing so on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, on a more consistent basis of including Fridays generally throughout the year, but particularly during Lent. Many of us are guilty of over-stuffing or over-indulging in food for a variety of reason, and we all could eat a little less and feel better for it. When we add a spiritual dimension to our act of fasting and abstinence from meat by connecting it with what Christ endured in the sacrifice of His life for us on the cross, then our physical hunger can be reflected to our spiritual hunger for Christ's life and presence. In our Lenten devotions and prayers, let us incorporate the corporal and spiritual works of mercy in our prayerful intentions, as we ask God for His grace to grow in our capacity and readiness to practice them throughout our lives in a more consistent and regular manner, praying that we might become more merciful to others as God is merciful to us.
