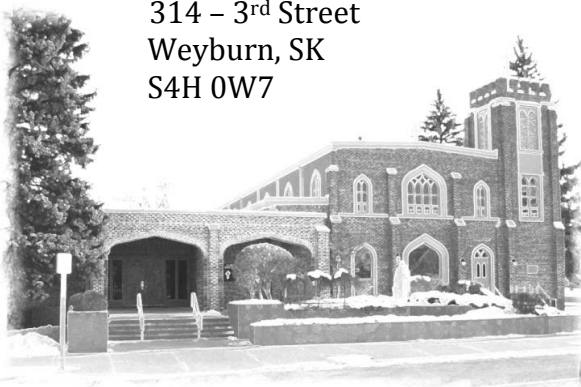

Good News!

In the days of the exile in Babylon, the Jews were unable to practice their religion, to gather as a community, or to hear the words of the Torah, which had so guided them in their lives as a people of God. I have always been taken by the description of this reading of the Law in Nehemiah, which occurs shortly after their return from exile. As Ezra reads, the people weep, rejoicing because they were hearing God's words to them as though for the first time and were overjoyed because God had brought them back home. I can't say I have ever wept at the beauty and power of Scripture when it is read at Mass, nor have I seen others do so. When we have not been deprived of a treasure we sometimes take it for granted and fail to appreciate the gift that it is.

In the Gospel, Jesus reads the words of Isaiah and declares to those in the synagogue that the words have been fulfilled. The people's reaction, which we hear as Luke 4 continues (next week), simply is not the same. Throughout our own lives, we have reacted to the comfort and challenge of the Gospel in different ways at different times. Sometimes we may be touched by what we hear, but I wonder if we often do not allow God's word to affect us as much as it could. Maybe today we can really open ourselves to what the Lord has to say in the sacred stories. Maybe today we can recognize the true value of God's revelation, care, and call to us in the Bible.

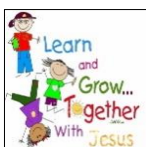

FROM PASTOR'S DESK:

Since last June we have been praying for Archbishop Daniel Bohan's health, then he was admitted to Palliative Care after Christmas. We are saddened to hear of his death last Friday morning, and now a week later we are celebrating his funeral with many bishops and priests from across Canada and from the whole Archdiocese. His death after his ten years tenure as our Archbishop was characterized by his desire to impart the Pastoral Plan helping parishes to remember the principal reasons why we are constituted as parishes and what our primary objectives should be in the midst of our existence. We are called to thrive, not just to survive! May his soul rest in peace, and God grants him eternal rest in heaven.

With the latest decision of the Supreme Court to grant a four month extension to Parliament to grant legislation on the matter of doctor assisted suicide beyond the February 6th deadline that they had established as the end of the prohibition on this matter, we are also hearing from various doctors how difficult it will be to put the framework and protocol in place to accord with this new "legislated" form of killing. We need to be encouraging our government, health regions and physicians to put in place greater access to a wide range of palliative care as a more dignified way of accompanying and managing the process of dying. As families, parishes, and communities we need to discuss what we can do individually and collectively to accompany those who are dying, as we communicate clearly what we can do for each other when this time comes for all of us. All of this should be geared towards helping the person prepare emotionally, spiritually, financially and otherwise to meet death as their passage from this earthly life to eternity with God. Here there should be no acquiescence to hastening death either because of fear or convenience. I was heartened to read two articles passed on from concerned parishioners that tackled this whole topic head-on, with much reason and compassion. It is strange now that we are asking those same health personnel, and particularly doctors, who have been trained to save life and to prolong good health, will now be asked to terminate life which is not to be confused as agreeing to stop treatment if the person deems that it is no longer necessary given that there is a great likelihood that it will not help substantially if at all. Here the person is kept comfortable until they die naturally and in God's time. It may seem that it is pointless to write to our governments, both federally and provincially, to our College of Physicians (who seem to be moving away from protecting conscientious objectors in their association), but it is important of going on record to indicate our opposition to this direction our country sadly seems to be heading in. A new Holocaust, this one sanctioned by our governments and society, is looming on the horizon. May God bless us and preserve us from this horror. St. Joseph, pray for us.
