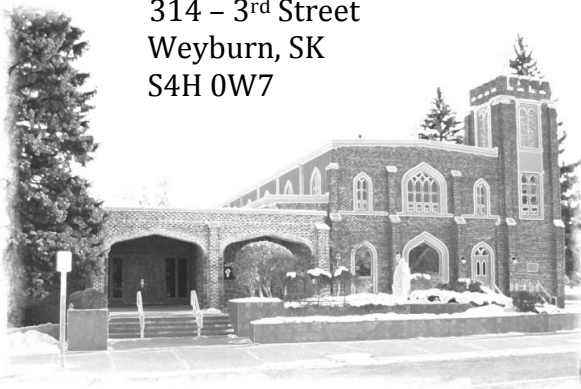

Good News!


In my work as a pastoral associate, I frequently speak with couples preparing for marriage. They often ask for suggestions about readings and desire to have something a little unconventional. When I ask what they mean, they will say something like, “We’ve heard that love reading so many times, and some of the gospel readings we have heard aren’t what we want to say.” I ask them what they think love is and, after a pause, they begin to tell me what they believe about love. It usually includes words like patient, humble, wanting the good of the other. We look at the reading from Corinthians again and they suddenly understand why so many choose it. It is one of the more beautiful descriptions of love that we have, and the love Paul describes is grounded in the Lord—God’s love for us and the love we must have for each other.

I think the ending of the passage is of greatest importance to marriage and the Christian life. Marriage is a process of becoming known. We “put aside childish things,” like unrealistic notions of romantic love, and work at loving a real person. Spouses begin their marriage knowing each other only partially but grow in understanding with each passing day. That wisdom leads to unity and transforms the spouses. This movement mirrors our life with God. We know very little as baptized infants and children. But as we pray, worship, and serve, we come to know God more and more until we meet him face to face and our lives are one with his.

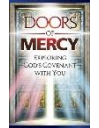

Do you get jealous? Do you focus more on the things that other people have than on the gifts that God has given to you? Are you pompous? Do you acquire more possessions to impress others? At times we are all guilty of these things. Pray for more humility. Pray to become less self-centered and more God-centered.

Year of Mercy When speaking to others, the love and mercy of God must flow from our lips. But how? What should our speech look like? One way to examine our speech to others is to look at it in the light of how we should speak to God. When speaking to God we should speak with honesty, simplicity, humility and confidence. Think of a sincere child praying to God. This pure soul exudes these qualities well. So should we. And if we speak to God with these qualities, they will also be a good guide in our speech to others.

Reflect upon the people and conversations that you have. Do you speak from pride or sarcasm? Do you struggle with gossip or carelessness? Think about what your speech would look like if it were honest, simple, humble and confident in God's grace. Joy will be present in each conversation guided by these virtues.

FROM PASTOR'S DESK:

With the month of January behind us, spring cannot be far behind; although we realize that February to April can throw us a few nasty spells of winter weather. But truth be told, we have managed to get through two months of winter relatively easy with the odd few days of extreme cold, some wind, but really quite mild as winters go. Maybe this is because Lent and Easter are so early with Ash Wednesday occurring already on February 10th and Easter on March 27th, because Lent originates from an old English word which refers to the lengthening of the days associated with spring. In conjunction with the Year of Mercy and our Lenten season, we are excited to be offering a DVD series and brief study entitled "*Doors of Mercy: Exploring God's Covenant with You.*" When Mary Ann and I started to examine the parish calendar of events, we quickly realized that there was not going to be an ideal weekday evening which would not conflict or potentially leave some group out because there was another meeting, event, or study happening on some of those week nights. We were almost thinking that Sunday afternoon might be our only option, and this was not ideal either, particularly for those families who try to schedule other family events at that time. So I am suggesting that we try this on Friday evenings after the Stations of the Cross at 7 PM. The group leading the Stations would not be expected to facilitate the "Doors of Mercy" program, as I would lead this aspect of the evening. Each of the DVD's are short enough, approximately 15 minutes, and we would start with an opening prayer, receive a small handout to take home for personal reflection, and then close with a prayer. From my vantage, I see this might help to boost the attendance at the Stations of the Cross (a truly valuable and precious Catholic devotion for everyone) and also provide some good content on the Year of Mercy. We are hoping that this will help encourage wider attendance to the whole set of 6 Friday evenings for the Stations beyond just the group or organization leading the Stations on that particular evening, as seems to happen. Since the DVD series consist of eight episodes, on two evenings we will to combine two episodes hopefully in such a way not to make it too long. My hope would be that we would pray with great devotion, not rushing our prayers, but still be able to leave between 8 or 8:15 PM. Lenten Fridays are meant to be penitential and what better reflection and meditation is there than pondering the great sacrifice Christ willingly suffered for our redemption, and how this outpouring of Mercy greatly enriches and strengthens on our path to greater holiness and a deeper spiritual and truly Christian Catholic life. I am asking everyone to consider offering this Lent for our country for the deeper conversion of Canadian society towards the dignity of human life founded in the Mercy of God.
