

Good News!

When we were growing up, my siblings and I would often ask our grandmother to tell us stories about our mother when she was young. We liked listening to our mother tell those same stories from her perspective. The stories varied in some details, but it always felt like a veil was lifted on the past and we had some sense of where we came from along with some insight about our mother's personality.

She, of course, did the same thing for my daughters, making them giggle at the story of my getting into her perfume bottle when I was three. Such stories connect us with the people we know. Old friends trade stories of shared experiences; young companions learn about the world from the stories of their elders and even from the stories their friends tell them about their lives.

In Acts, Peter appeals to his listeners by telling the story they know so well. He even appeals to their shared experience as he says, "You know..." (v. 36). Stories connect us to one another and open the door to understanding each other a little more and a little better. In his story, Peter marks the baptism of Jesus as the beginning of his ministry. Our story in the Christian community begins with baptism as well.

Peter records that Jesus went on "doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil, for God was with him" (v. 38). What would the story of our lives after baptism tell people about us? Would someone like Peter tell people that we went about doing good and loving God and neighbor?

Holy Hour of Adoration will be held Wednesday, Jan. 20th at 7 PM. Come spend an hour with Jesus.





FROM PASTOR'S DESK:

St. Luke records how Jesus came to the synagogue in Nazareth and read these words from the scroll of the prophet Isaiah: "The Spirit of the Lord God is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me to bring good tidings to the afflicted; He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and freedom to those in captivity; to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour." (Luke 4:18-19 cf. Isaiah 61:1-2) Now Pope Francis speaks of this year of the Lord's favour as being the year of mercy which is at the forefront about Jesus' mission on earth, which we are all to be immersed into during this Jubilee Year of Mercy. We are challenged and invited to adopt the lifestyle which seeks "to bring a word and gesture of consolation to the poor, to proclaim liberty to those bound by new forms of slavery in modern society, to restore sight to those who can see no more because they are caught up in themselves, to restore dignity to all those from whom it has been robbed." (Mercy, #16) Here we can connect these words of our Pope to the Christian response to the plight of many who are suffering in our world because of human trafficking and exploitation, those caught in the web of addictions, including pornography, and the inner blindness of our hearts and souls because of our attachment and greed for material possessions which fails to recognize any sense of obligation for those who are poor and hungry because of economic hardships and destitution. These modern forms of enslavement and captivity help us to realize the continuing relevancy of Jesus' words at the inauguration of His public ministry and mission, and how they inform our own involvement in the plight of many who suffer so much because our inhumanity to our fellow human beings. These groups of people might be considered as more below the surface of our consciousness and daily awareness, but when we add to them the millions of refugees world-wide seeking a safe haven and a fresh start in life, then we realize just how great the challenge for us to act with the compassion and mercy of Christ. By no means does this even suggest an avoidance and abrogation of our responsibility to constantly practice mercy and forgiveness in our dealings with those in our families and communities (parishes included) from whom we are estranged and not on speaking terms for any number of reasons. We would do well to reflect upon the Passion of Christ and how He willingly died for the forgiveness of all sins, and how He is inviting us to participate and join Him in this gesture and activity of forgiveness in our own lives as we join ourselves to Him, praying from the cross, as He would want us to imitate too: "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they are doing." Lord Jesus Christ, have mercy on me, a sinner!
