

Male or female, ordained or lay, old or young, we often give in to what tempts us because it looks so good in the moment. Only later do we realize the harm we have done to ourselves or someone else. The woman with the jar of ointment knew only too well that her life was not perfect. But she also heard Jesus' invitation to repent and the love in his message. She laid her life and her service at his feet and knew the forgiveness of God. The Pharisee, on the other hand, could not imagine that he needed forgiveness and so was not open to the transformation that Jesus offered.

All of us sin and are in need of forgiveness. When we ask for and accept that forgiveness in our lives, we are able to give far more than we can imagine. Just ask Mary, Joanna, Susanna, and all the other women and men who followed Jesus.

### FROM PASTOR'S DESK:

The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops has recently published a short document entitled "The Beauty of Mercy: Pope Francis and Confession" and I thought that it might be timely to share some of its content and spirit. With the force of his personal experience and conviction, Pope Francis states: "Among the Sacraments, certainly Reconciliation renders present with particular efficacy the merciful face of God." This sacrament flows directly from the Paschal Mystery of Christ's death and resurrection whereby on that first Easter evening the Risen Lord appeared to the Apostles, declaring "Peace be with you!" and as He breathed on them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven." (Jn. 20:21-23) While we struggle with being forgiving towards ourselves, Pope Francis stresses that forgiveness of our sins is not something we can give ourselves. In confession, we ask forgiveness from Jesus. "Forgiveness is not the fruit of our own efforts but rather a gift, it is a gift of the Holy Spirit who fills us with the wellspring of mercy and of grace that flows unceasingly from the open heart of the Crucified and Risen Christ." Pope Francis goes on to emphasize that it is not enough to simply ask the Lord for forgiveness in one's own mind and heart because Jesus Himself entrusted to the Church the ministry of the forgiveness of sins. "It is necessary humbly + trustingly to confess one's sins to a minister of the Church. In the celebration of this Sacrament, the priest represents not only God but also the whole community." Rather than staying away from the Sacrament because we think that we are often confessing the same old sins that we have fallen habitually into, we should remember that God never tires of forgiving us over and over again, but that it is we ourselves who grow weary of asking for forgiveness. How else do we hope to break the pattern of habitual sin, if not by seeking the grace and mercy of God to strengthen in our resolve to avoid and refrain from this sin? God is pure mercy, and with His mercy God will cure all the wounds caused by sin. Pope Francis invites all priests to have the heart of the merciful father towards the prodigal son who returns home after coming to his senses, by listening, accompanying and encouraging. "Mercy means carrying the burden of a brother or sister and helping them walk. The confessor who prays, the confessor who weeps, the confessor who knows that he is more a sinner than the penitent, and if he himself has never done the bad thing that the penitent speaks of, it is but for the grace of God. Merciful is being close and accompanying the process of conversion." Pope Francis reminds priests that they can learn from the conversion and repentance of those who are confessing to them, to love the Lord as they do, to have a merciful heart towards others as they do, and to have the faith that they reflect.
