Good News!

A few years ago at the ice rink my daughters skated at, I picked up an ad for hockey gear. The pictures showed shoulder pads, shin guards, helmets, and chest pads. What caught my eye was the name of the company and the way they advertised. This was "Christian Protective Gear." I immediately began chuckling to myself as I imagined the Apostle Paul calling on all of us to "put on the armor" of righteousness and wondering if this was what he had in mind (Ephesians 6:10–17). I think not, but the reading from Galatians reminded me of the ad: "you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselveswith Christ." What does that mean for us today?

The Church teaches that we must show forth the love and mercy of God, especially with regard to the least and poorest among us. In a poem by St. Teresa of Ávila, we are reminded that "Christ has no body but yours, / No hands, no feet on earth but yours." In today's Gospel, Jesus says that to put on Christ is to follow in his footsteps, to take up our cross daily, and to lose our lives for his sake that we might find them forever. Most of us can get behind love, mercy, and compassion for others—at least in theory—but discipleship in its fullest is no easy task. Are we willing to live our lives as Christ even when it isn't easy, when it requires denying ourselves and suffering? Only we can answer that, and with God's help through grace and the sacraments, the answer can be "yes!"

FROM PASTOR'S DESK:

Happy Father's Day to all Dads! The question Jesus asks of His apostles in today's gospel: "Who do you say I am?" is one I daresay could be on the lips of many dads. Would that every father ask themselves that question, but not allowing their role to be undermined and marginalized by the negation and trivialization of the popular media and cultural trends in our society. This past Tuesday, I read a most interesting article by Fr. Carter Griffin in the June issue of the Columbia magazine entitled "Forming Fathers Today", which highlights comments from his booklet "The Gift of Fatherhood" available on the Fathers for Good website (.org). Fr. Griffin opens with this statement: "What may be called the fullness of fatherhood has its origin in God the Father, who shares His life-generating capacity with all men – both those who procreate biologically and those who live for others as single and celibate persons." Fr. Griffin goes on to say, "Only God can create an immortal soul, and thus He is rightly called the Father 'from whom every family in heaven and on earth takes its name.' (Ephesians 3:15)". He points out that biological fatherhood does not end on the physical level, as a child requires faith formation and human education, and all this takes time, attention and self-giving. The experience of fatherhood draws a man out of himself, as his heart should be changed by looking upon his child, so that "any sacrifice or hardship becomes worthwhile for the sake of the child who has captured his heart." While change can be painful, because he "has to stretch his limits, mature, live in the present and work for the future," such a man "truly takes hold of his fatherhood." The concept of fostering the "domestic church" in every home encourages all dads with the duty of leading the family in the everyday practice of the faith. This leadership is exercised with humility, joy, grace and love, as it involves a constant "dying to self so that others may grow and thrive. The ultimate goal of fatherhood is to generate children of God – humbly leading others to their God-given potential and ultimately to life with our Father in heaven." Fr. Griffin invites all dads to this mission, "beginning with God at the center, praying with their wives and children, looking to the needs of others through the corporal and spiritual works of mercy, and placing it all upon a foundation of love, forgiveness, sacrifice, support, self-discipline, humility and grace." On this Father's Day, may all dads strive to become a father from the Father's heart by laying the foundations for your domestic church. Your gift of leadership and good example will far surpass any tangible gifts you might receive today, as it represents a rich legacy for your own children and many more besides them, and it will influence and guide future generations potentially also. May God bless you all!
