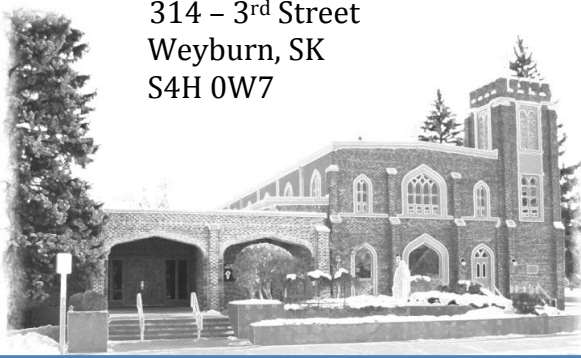

Good News!

My father died when I was eighteen. For a long time I clung to the Lord in my pain. For a longer time, I was angry and often wondered where God was. I looked for answers in vain. For those of us who have watched someone die, today's readings may seem unrealistic. Elijah the prophet stretches himself out on a dead child and calls on God to restore his life. The child lives. Jesus stops a funeral procession and bids the dead son of a widow to get up. He does so. "Where was God," we might ask, "when my [father, wife, child, or friend] died and left me to mourn?"

The truth is, God was and is there. In God, we have the hope of eternal life. Moreover, the faithful departed remain present to the living through the communion of saints, the stories and memories we hold and share, and in my case, the care I received from those who became a bit like fathers to me when I needed it most. Through God's grace, I am now more compassionate and caring toward those who have suffered loss. I will not fool you: forty five years later, I still miss my father and wish my children could have known him. But in the Gospels, we hear the truth. God offers to all who believe and follow him the gift of resurrection at the end of our earthly lives and brings us new life even in the midst of death and suffering. This new life is the hope and joy of our faith, even if it takes us a little while to realize it.

FROM PASTOR'S DESK:

With another month of school to go and the summer season well underway, there are more activities to attend and participate in, which tends to leave the parish finding it a little harder to continue to maintain its regular celebrations, as those with cottages, campers and trailers want to take advantage of all this beautiful weather. Finding lectors, Communion ministers, servers, screen projector operators, and hospitality folks is something one readily accepts as part of the summer holiday period, and it sometimes leads to creative solutions which can result in unexpected people to step up to the plate. But already starting in late May and continuing until September, our financial contributions become a little meager as fewer people are present to drop their regular Sunday offerings. Yet church expenses and salaries, plus the ongoing maintenance and repairs, remain a reality that we must deal with, so I might suggest that people consider making up their contributions for those Sundays that they are away from the parish, especially when it is extended for several Sundays over the summer. I hope that everyone is attending Sunday Mass while they are away and one wants to support the local parish one is attending when the collection plate is passed around, but still the responsibility to your home parish is not absolved or removed. Those on the pre-authorized donation plan have taken this into consideration and maybe more people should give some serious reflection on adopting this practice. We remain most grateful to all those families and individuals who are contributing generously and regularly to the parish's financial operation, because obviously this is what sustains our operation on a weekly basis. Although I have included the breakdown of contributors and the actual expenses associated with the operation of the church and McKenna (in terms of utilities, insurance and taxes) in the "Thank You" letter that accompanies the receipts at year's end, it might be helpful to re-visit this again. Here it is helpful to keep in mind that McKenna Catering generates revenue to offset those expenses to some extent, but at the end of the day, whether McKenna is being utilized or under-utilized those expenses must be met by the parish. How are you personally contributing to those cost on a weekly or monthly basis? Based on the 2015 information, it is most revealing that those giving \$1000 and more (representing 30% of our donors) gave 71% of our total revenues. I am appealing to the 70% to consider becoming more generous over time, because we will need everyone's participation to make this work for the whole parish.
