Good News!

My daughter was about four when we went to the local department store to do some shopping. I was looking over some item when I turned and realized that she wasn't beside me. It was not like her to wander away, and I spent a frantic fifteen minutes before I located her sitting on the floor playing with a doll from a display. I was at once relieved and angry, but more scared than anything else. What if something had happened?

When Mary Magdalene went to the tomb that early Sunday morning, she expected to find Jesus'body and mourn the loss of this man whom they all loved. Not finding him where she expected was an utter shock. I can only imagine there was some fear and anger: "Who took him? Where did he go? How could someone do this?" Her words tumbled out to Peter and the disciple Jesus loved. They, too, were astounded to find his burial cloth and though they believed, they did not understand what the empty tomb signified.

I can also imagine what they felt when they finally saw Jesus—surely relief and wonder, but there may have been a little anger that he had left them and fear for all that meant. Maybe that's how God feels about us when we wander away. We were lost, and God sent the prophets first and then his only Son to find us and lead us home. Out of love, Jesus gave his life and conquered death itself. In this Easter season, let us take great care neither to wander away nor to lose sight of the Lord. He is the source of our life. We belong to him.







FROM PASTOR'S DESK:

Ash Wednesday began with the exhortation to "return to the Lord with all of one's heart", as we were invited to rebuild our relationship with God and our neighbor through the practice of true contrition, fasting, almsgiving and prayer. I suggested that these four pillars would help us in a balanced approach to Lent, whereby we are challenged to practice self-denial and sacrifice to create more room for God through prayer and reflection upon His Word, as well to foster greater compassion and generosity towards our neighbor in need and thus to grow in our appreciation for God's mercy in our lives through a deeper repentance and conversion of our hearts. How well we have done is not a matter of how close to perfection we have come, but more a matter of how much we have grown in our openness to God's grace and mercy. The more we can allow God's grace and mercy to work within us helps us to grow in the holiness God is calling each one of us. Coming through the Easter Triduum of the Lord's Supper with Jesus washing the feet of His disciples, His passion and death on Good Friday, waiting with His mournful disciples on Holy Saturday before the exuberant joy of the Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday celebrating His triumphant resurrection, we do not abandon everything we have acquired and practiced in Lent, as if we could go back to our pre-Lenten frivolity and mediocrity. No, our turning to the Lord with all our hearts is something we continue going forward, so that our renewed faith and faithfulness to the Lord we foster evermore in our deepened relationship with God and our improved relationship with our neighbor. Our Easter Octave with the continuation of the Divine Mercy Novena began on Good Friday brings us to the celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday, with a renewed appreciation of what Christ has accomplished for us and the whole world through the sacrifice of His sufferings and death. Just as we notice the disciples of Jesus struggling to truly believe that Jesus is truly risen from the dead, so that they might grasp just how differently their lives will now be as a result, so too we are required to work through the implications of Christ's resurrection for our lives in terms of becoming His witnesses in words and deeds. Life can never be just the same as it was before, as we grow in our faith understanding and our devotion and commitment to Christ and His gospel. Pope Francis invites each Catholic Christian to become more missionary in their outreach to others, as we bring the effects of the risen life of Christ to them by our renewed kindness, support and encouragement, as we accompany them in the journey of life with the joy and steadfast mercy of Christ. Happy Easter! Alleluia!! He is truly Risen!!
