
Good News!

One of the deep meanings of this Gospel reading is signaled in verse 2: "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them." Last Sunday, Jesus challenged the people to realize they were no better than those they condemned. The Pharisees and scribes had trouble with that lesson. They felt morally superior and more entitled to God's favor than those whose lives they questioned. Jesus turned that attitude on its head, showing time and again that God seeks out the sinner and the lost, particularly those who recognize that they are sinners and lost. As long as the Pharisees and scribes did not see themselves that way, Jesus could not help them.

Dictionary.com Unabridged says prodigal means "wastefully or recklessly extravagant," so someone who is prodigal is lavish, a spendthrift. According to the Pharisees, Jesus was prodigal, for they considered his welcome of sinners as wildly wasteful, frittering away time and resources on people they thought were unworthy. But Jesus simply was showing them, and all of us, what God's love is like. God is extravagant in his love for saints and sinners alike. To some it might seem pointless or unjust to love and care for sinners and enemies, but God finds no one unworthy or unlovable—even those who reject him and oppress others.

Lent is a time to accept our sinfulness, our lost condition, and return home to the Father. Like the father of the prodigal son, God waits for that warm embrace, willing to give us everything. Hurry now.



FROM PASTOR'S DESK:

The 2016 Development & Peace Share Lent campaign is based on the theme: "Create a Climate of Change", inspired upon Pope Francis' Encyclical Letter, "On Care for Our Common Home", which we have previously dissected and examined at great length this past year. Within this Encyclical Letter, Pope Francis has challenged us and the whole world to recognize some of the trends both economically and technologically which are having serious impacts on the environment and need to be examined in the light of how those policies and practices are having serious consequences for the survival of our planet and are having the most direct impact upon those living in our more impoverished countries. It is not just a matter of acting to save and preserve the environment but how this is affecting directly the lives of our brothers and sisters living in those countries that are showing signs of being most directly affected by how the unchecked and unrestricted use of modern technology and production are causing greater suffering for large segments of the world's population. While much of society's focus has been on the plight of our growing refugee population and how we might be assisting to re-settle in safer situations, and this remains a very important work of emergency proportion and urgency, the attention of the Development & Peace initiative on the matters of the climate change are not contrary to the assistance we are seeking to provide our refugees but working in tangent with those goals and aspirations. Wherever we can improve the lot of those who are impoverished and hungry, we are resolving the instability that allows conflict and violence to thrive as another alternative to addressing their needs. If peaceful harmony and cooperation among the nations of the world does not result in a hopeful redressing of the issues of hunger, poverty and injustice, then there might be those who will arise and take advantage of the unsecured aspirations and dreams of people who are desperate to obtain a better future and lifestyle for themselves and their families. It is not enough to simply address crime and violence on their own, without addressing also the systemic conditions that allow conflict and criminal activities to flourish in those countries where many people are feeling increasingly marginalized and falling further behind what they see as the more affluent people in the more industrialized and progressive economies enjoying, while they have so little. As we contribute to the special collection on March 13th, dubbed Solidarity Sunday for Development & Peace, we are providing hope and encouragement to those who most need it in our world. It is all part of the works of mercy that this Jubilee Year of Mercy is fostering.
