
# **Good News!**

Our daughter married into a large Italian family whose get-togethers include dozens of people. (More than fifty were there for Christmas dinner, and not everyone could make it.) Ours is a small and often-quiet family, so Katy had to get used to more noise and activity than she had growing up. It was like learning a new language. It's often that way when couples wed. Over time, we come to know the inside jokes, the way the in-laws mark occasions, who we can joke with and who prefers a more serious interaction. Just as with growing up in our own families, we become a part of them, and they become a part of us.

When the Holy Spirit descended on those gathered in the upper room, it was like a wedding. They had to learn the language of God's family—one that included proclamation, sharing, repentance, and mercy. They had to learn what it meant to be part of one body, using their unique gifts to build on what Christ had already started. With the Holy Spirit as inspiration and source of grace, the disciples and apostles were sent to testify and invite the world to the eternal life that Christ offers.

In any relationship it takes time to get to know the other. God has the advantage in his relationship with us—he already knows us fully and intimately. In getting to know him and learning his language, we may feel awkward or out-of-place. But he constantly welcomes and invites us to be a part of his life and Church, knowing we might eventually come to live with him forever.

#### FROM PASTOR'S DESK:

This Sunday's celebration of Pentecost marks the conclusion of our Easter season with the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples of Jesus gathered with the Blessed Virgin Mary to pray and to await for what Jesus had promised at His Ascension whom the Father would send to empower them for the mission and ministry of reconciliation and evangelization He was entrusting to them to bring to the whole world. For all those who have been baptized and confirmed, Pentecost is an excellent opportunity to pray for a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit into our hearts and souls, particularly for the sevenfold gifts of the Holy Spirit: wisdom, understanding, knowledge, right judgment, courage, reverence, and the wonder and awe in God's presence. When we are floundering and acting without seemingly any clear purpose and direction, we pray for a renewed consciousness of the Holy Spirit within us. For those who subscribe to the Living with Christ missal or monthly missalette, I would invite you to read the introduction for Pentecost Sunday. After the author has spoken of her role as teacher and mother with teenage children, she refers to today's youth having a world of instant information literally at their fingertips, yet this is not wisdom or understanding, or any of the other gifts of the Holy Spirit that we all need to be in touch in our lives. When many young people are drawn to think that they are their Facebook status or latest selfie, they need to be told who they really are - children of God. Because we have not thought and reflected enough on this fact, it sounds so trite and easy to say that we are the children of God, as if it were of no consequence or terrible importance. To say that we are the children of God means acknowledging that we have been created in the image and likeness of God, redeemed by the death and resurrection of Christ, and sanctified by faith and baptism in the Holy Spirit. Because of this we are called to become more Christ-like and true sharers and participants in His divinity. Our author writes in the Living with Christ: "We need that reminder, too. Caught up in our worlds and worries, it's easy to forget to pray. We call it 'stress' but really it's forgetfulness. We have forgotten who we are, whose we are and sadly, we have forgotten what power we have at our fingertips if we just clasp them together in prayer. Look for Holy Spirit's nudge. What is it urging you to do? Listen for the lesson and learn from it. For there is no better teacher or mentor than the very Spirit of God within," Come, Holy Spirit, enkindle the fire of Your love within us, and renew the face of the earth. May the Holy Spirit of truth and grace come to each of us to strengthen the life of Christ within us and help us to share the mercy of God with all those we encounter, so that our world may be imbued with this steadfast mercy in all things.
