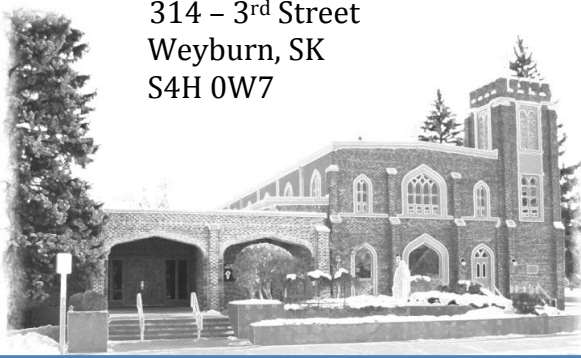

Good News!

On a once-in-a-lifetime trip to Spain, my husband and I were privileged to witness a Corpus Christi procession near Barcelona that wound its way from the church through the streets and back to the church. At the head of the procession was a large ornate monstrance with a consecrated host inside held aloft on a platform carried by some of the priests assisted by others. Following behind was another priest incensing the monstrance and then the various church groups beginning with the children and including what I imagine were orders like the Knights of Columbus or the Solidarity of Mary. The mood was not solemn, but celebratory. Flowers marked the path and the participants. In a tradition dating back to the sixteenth century, an egg was dancing on the water spout in the church fountain. We were enchanted.


I do remember processions around my church—though never through the town—when I was a child, but they were solemn affairs and did not resemble the celebration we witnessed. What captured my imagination in Spain was the absolute joy on the faces of those processing. I remember the singing and the laughter and wonder, “What better response could we give to the Lord who gives himself to us in the Eucharist?”

Whether we process or not, whether we are in prayer before the tabernacle or monstrance or just going about our day, let us project the joy that comes from knowing the Lord and encountering him under the appearances of bread and wine which have become the Body and Blood of Christ.

FROM PASTOR'S DESK:

From the example of Abram giving a tithe or tenth of everything he had to the priest Melchizedek to Jesus' exhortation to the twelve apostles to provide food themselves to the large crowd, today's multiplication of the loaves from the meager amount of five loaves and two fish is an invitation to become generous with whatever the Lord has given us. The stewardship of our resources, temporal or personal, is very much connected to the overall stewardship of our time and abilities when it comes to others, whether they are family, friends or even strangers. Chances are good that if we find it hard to spend time listening or helping others, that we will also limit how much we are willing to give monetarily to assisting others, and vice versa. Those who are naturally inclined to go out of their way to show supportive listening and compassionate help to those in need won't mind being generous financially in their support of God's work within the Church and beyond. During these economic hardships and the general downturn in the overall economy, it is perhaps understandable why some people might be inclined to pull back and to give more conservatively and much less to those institutions and charities who are dependent upon their good will and generosity just as much, if not more during these harder times, than in times of prosperity and more affluence. Tithing may seem out of reach for many, but breaking it down over a period of time may make it more attainable than some might think at first. Nor should we regard 10 % the maximum that we can give; it all depends on our point of view and what we value and where we are hoping to leave a legacy. Do we give a set amount every Sunday based on something we decided upon years ago and has remained constant through the years despite the smaller buying power of that dollar over inflation and time? Do we give from the top of our income, or simply what is left over after everything else is taken care of and really is hardly more than what is left over and surplus to us, something we will not miss in the least? As we reflect upon the gift and legacy of those who built this parish and McKenna Auditorium over the years, how do we ensure that this legacy we have received continues to thrive and remain strong for the upcoming generations? While these physical and concrete structures are finite in themselves, yet through their life expectancy they provide a much needed physical space to gather and worship, to meet and discuss, to come together and to socialize and to build up the bonds that we share in Christ, all of which would be harder if not impossible to sustain over the long haul. We bear a responsibility to look after, to preserve and to enhance what we have received through the efforts of others. May God bless with greater generosity and mercy, for God is certainly generous and merciful with us. Thanks be to God!
