Good News!

In Luke's ascension account from Acts, Jesus admonishes his apostles to stay in Jerusalem and wait for the Spirit because they are witnesses of his mission and message. When the time for his ascension comes, Jesus blesses them, then "was lifted up" (1:9). We don't hear the great commission to go out to, preach to, and baptize all nations as we do in Matthew's Gospel (28:19-20). Instead, Luke's account leaves us with an image of the apostles joyfully returning to Jerusalem: "They were continually in the temple praising God" (24:53).

Returning to Acts, I love that the early disciples' first order of business—even prior to Pentecost—was to gather to pray (1:14). Paul often admonished the early Christians to pray constantly. He knew that prayer grounds us in the Lord and strengthens us to lay down our lives and carry our crosses. Prayer focuses our attention on God's call and our response to it. The apostles' prayer opened them to receive the promised gift of the Spirit and strengthened them for their mission—to let the world know that Jesus is Lord, that the Kingdom of God has come, and that we have been restored through the death and resurrection of Christ.


Thus should our week begin: in praise and worship before God, in gathered prayer. Like the disciples in Jerusalem, the Lord will open our minds "to understand the scriptures" (Luke 24:45). We, too, will be filled with the Spirit and be sent out as joyful witnesses to God's presence and saving work.

FROM PASTOR'S DESK:

Happy Mothers' Day to all Moms called to share in this special responsibility. Nothing could prepare you for this most vital role that will witness great joys, but alas many disappointments and heartaches along the way. There is nothing except perhaps the example of the Blessed Virgin Mary when she and Joseph presented the Christ Child in the temple, as they encountered Simeon only to be told that a sword would pierce her heart. While many can assist and support the mother's role in raising children, there is no one individual who can fully assume and replace what she does in the formation of her child. Yes, I have heard of heroic dads and wonderful grandparents who step up to the plate should the mother die or be out of the picture, but the unique motherly bond is something so precious to be virtually irreplaceable. As a society we need to facilitate and maximize the time and its rich quality for all mothers with their children, rather than fragmenting or mitigating its influence and importance. There was nothing in Mary that is self-serving or about her own glorification, so that she would be trying to draw accolades and praise to herself. Her whole life and spirituality was about her Son and serving God to the full. As Mary was fully obedient and available to God's will in her life, she teaches us through her humility and example how we are to become fully obedient and devoted to doing God's will in all situations. By praying to Mary, we are seeking her encouragement and inspiration to become more open and more available in our response of generosity and compassion, mercy and forgiveness, loving service and gentle patience to others as we seek to follow the example of her Son. Mary was fully responsive to the outpouring of the Holy Spirit in her life, through whom she conceived God's Son in her womb and gave birth to Him for the redemption of the world, so she teaches us to respond ourselves to the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost and indeed every day of our lives. Mary, Mother of God, pray for us.
