Good News Reflection - God's love in good measure and overflowing

We can use this Sunday's Gospel passage as a checklist to survey our holiness. Jesus is outlining, in very clear terms, true Christian living. He describes how to love -- faithfully and unconditionally, which sometimes means sacrificially as well.

It's not an easy love, that's for sure. But it's God's love. This is how he loves us! And to remain in his love, we love others the same way he loves them. When we don't, we separate ourselves from God's love. That's why Confession is called the Sacrament of Reconciliation; it reunites us to God and to all those we've separated ourselves from through sin.

Love even your enemies, Jesus says. An "enemy" is anyone who opposes us in any way -- opposes our will, our desires, our needs, etc.

Holy living separates us from the world and unites us to God. Christianity is counter-cultural and counter-intuitive. It goes against our nature -- our fallen nature, that is. Our sinful nature. In our baptisms, we received God's nature. That means we have the ability to love as God loves. However, we need to rely on God's help (the Holy Spirit) to resist the pull back into sin and be holy instead.

"If you do good to those who do good to you, so what? Even sinners do that much." To remain in God's love, we do good to everyone, whether they deserve it or not.

If by the Spirit's help we genuinely love everyone, we become much more fully aware of the love that Jesus has for us -- in good measure and overflowing. It is, after all, *his* love that we give when we love others while they oppose us.

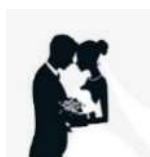

Bible Corner - Revelation VIII – Three-legged Stool Example

To better understand our three-legged stool analogy of last week we provide an example. In *Ordinatio Sacerdotalis* (1994) John Paul II stated, “Wherefore, in order that all doubt may be removed regarding a matter of great importance, a matter which pertains to the Church’s divine constitution itself, in virtue of my ministry of confirming the brethren (cf. Lk 22:32) I declare that the Church has no authority whatsoever to confer priestly ordination on women and that this judgment is to be definitively held by all the Church’s faithful.” Undoubtedly a difficult and sensitive subject, but in great humility he accepted the limits of his authority and that of the Church. Jesus Christ is head of the Church and from Scripture we know that He only chose men to be His apostles. Next week we look at Vatican II’s subtle change of Revelation to One Source.



Pope Francis and the Bishops from all over the world are using synods as a tool to gather the thoughts and opinions of laity as to what our church is and what we need to do going

forward. Canadian Bishops have asked that each parish gather this information to forward to the CCB and then to the Vatican. We need to LISTEN to others, LEARN from others, and then LEAD as a result of that listening and learning.

St. Vincent de Paul will be hosting a Synod meeting on February 19, 2022, at 10am-12pm at McKenna Upper Hall where Father Francis, Pat Wolensky and Jean Wagner will guide us through what Synod means. We will be gathering with our Deaneries and Parish Councils at the local level to begin this process as we “Walk together to follow Christ”. Lunch will be available from 12-1pm. **From 1pm-3pm, we will meet with the Archdiocese Pastoral Support Team** to go over the draft of the new Parish Pastoral Council Guidelines.
